

PASSIONATE PROFESSORS







ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- ☐ Graduate from high school (diploma or GED).
- ☐ Complete the required college preparatory courses (requirements A-G) with a grade of C- or better. *

(See A-G Requirements table)

- ☐ GPA: California resident or graduate of California high school: 2.5 or better

 Non-California resident: 3.0 or better
 - *An applicant who does not meet the minimum GPA may be considered on other academic or personal attributes.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT EXAMINATION

AP: Students may earn up to six semester units of baccalaureate credit for each Advanced Placement examination of the College Entrance Examination Board in which the applicant receives a score of 3. 4 or 5.

IB: International Baccalaureate courses designated as honors courses on the UC "A-G" list are awarded extra grade points for computation of the high school GPA. Students may earn up to six semester units of credit for each examination in which the applicant received a score of four or higher.

CLEP: Students may earn units of baccalaureate credit for College Level Entrance Program examinations which may be applied toward the degree and/or admission eligibility.

RECEIVING COLLEGE CREDIT

Baccalaureate-level courses taken in high school may be awarded transfer credit unless the college or university transcript designates that the courses were used solely to meet high school graduation requirements.

ACADEMIC READINESS

In order to increase equity and improve student success, the CSUs use multiple measures (test scores, GPAs, coursework, and in the case of writing placement, advising) to guide student placement into first-year math and English writing courses. Pathways are finalized after final high school transcripts are processed which can be viewed on the student center. The

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- ☐ 2.0 GPA of all college transferable courses
- ☐ Be in good standing at last college/ university attended
- ☐ Completion of the following requirements based on number of college transfer units (see Eligibility Requirement table below)

GENERAL EDUCATION (GE)

Upper division transfer students must have completed at least 30 semester units (45 quarter units) of GE courses. The subjects

listed must be completed with at least a C- or better.

- ☐ Oral Communication (Area A1):
 Public speaking course.
- ☐ Written Communication (Area A2): Freshman English composition course.
- ☐ Critical Thinking (Area A3): Logic or critical thinking course.

 (This area is met as part of the requirements of the engineering major.)
- ☐ Quantitative Reasoning (Area B4): Course that requires computational skills, mathematical or quantitative reasoning concepts to solve problems.

GRADE POINT AVERAGE (GPA)

A student must have a minimum overall GPA of 2.0. Applicants applying for an impacted major are offered admission based on overall space availability and may be held to a higher GPA standard.

RESOURCES FOR TRANSFER STUDENTS

Associate Degree for Transfer (ADT)

Students who earn an Associate Degree for Transfer (ADT) will receive admission to a CSU campus with junior status. Students who pursue a B.S. or B.A. by following an approved ADT pathway can complete the degree by taking no more than 60 units at SF State. Visit ueap.sfsu.edu/articulation/roadmaps for approved roadmaps. An ADT may also provide a GPA advantage when applying to an impacted major deemed similar.

California Promise

The California Promise program provides access to specialized advising and guaranteed course availability for students who maintain eligibility and are committed to graduating in a two-year time frame. Eligible transfer students* are invited to take the California Promise pledge early in the first semester. 

HOUSING
