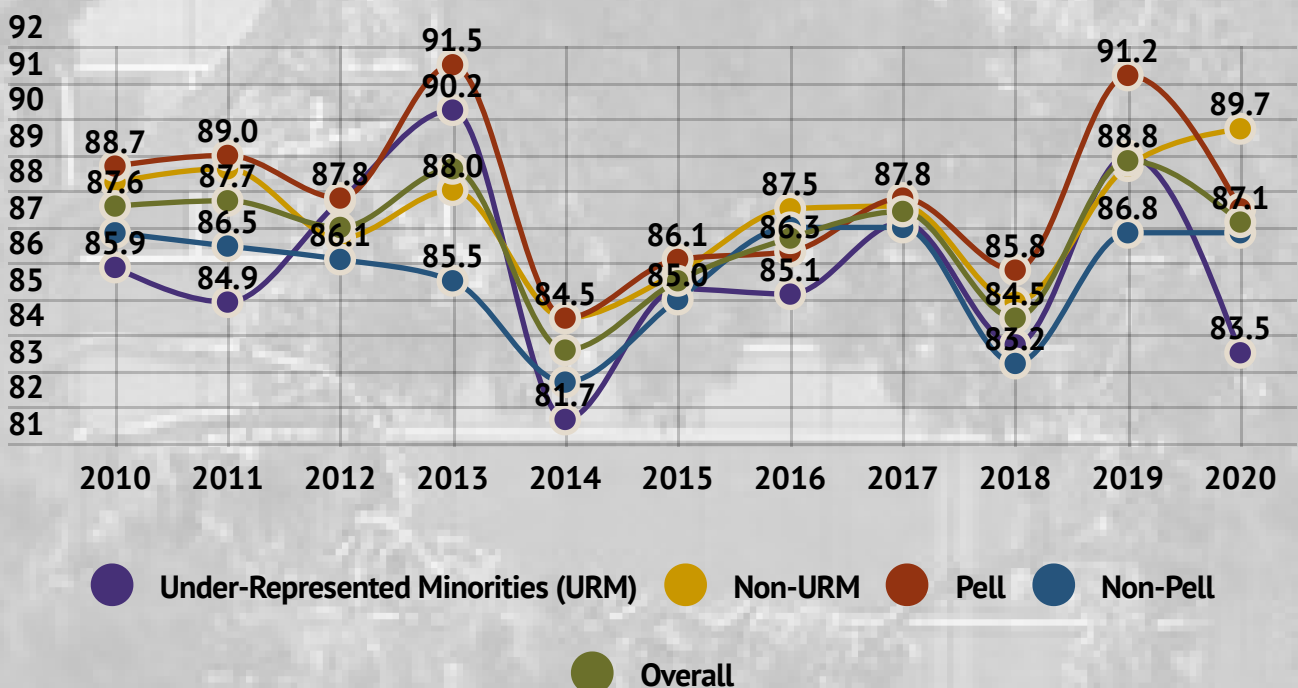

(Fall 2010-Fall 2020)

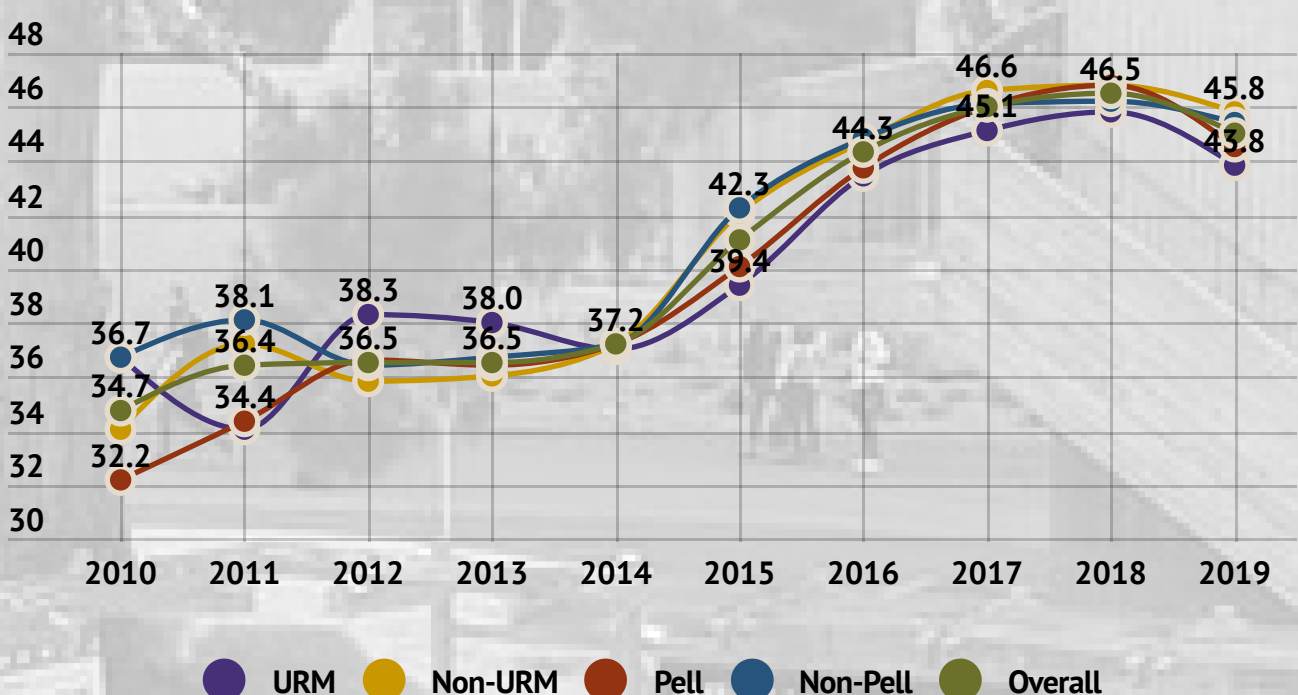


Line chart for Upper-Division Transfer 1st year retention rates over time, Fall 2010-Fall 2020.

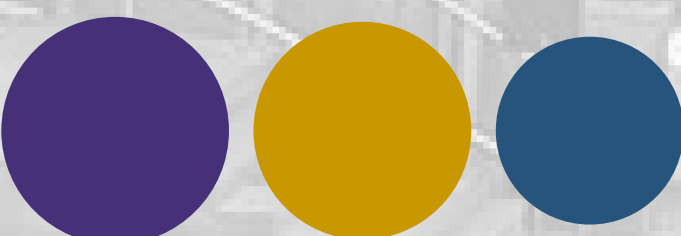

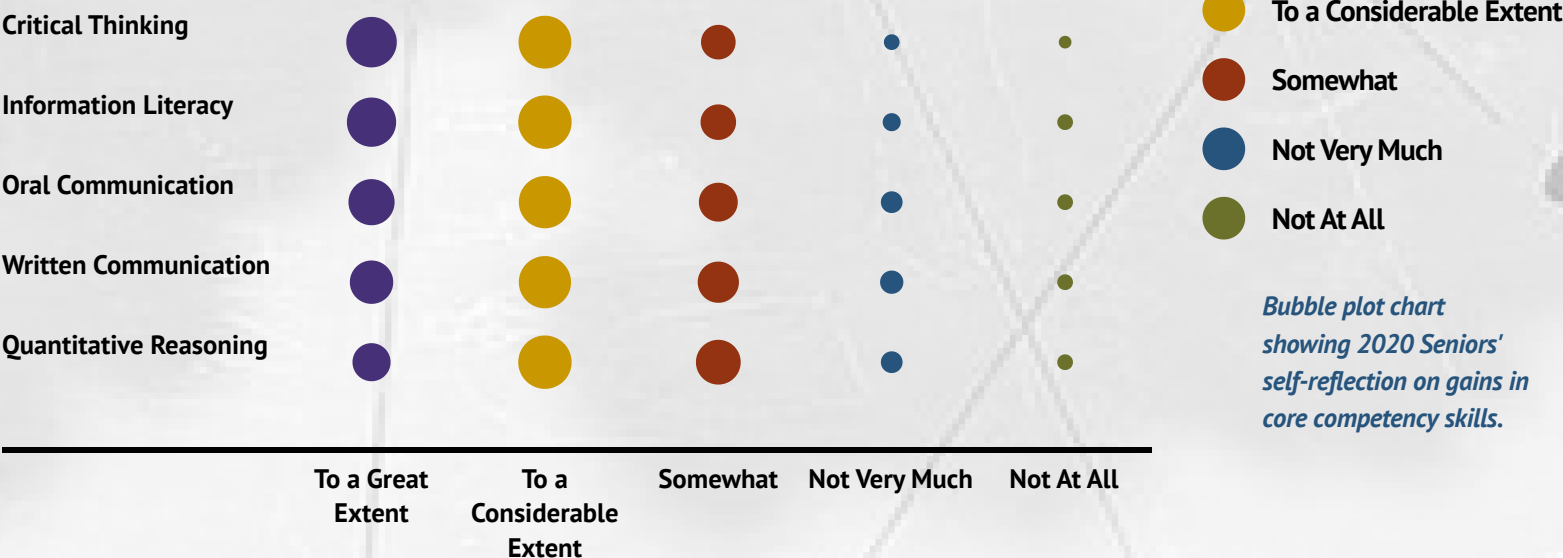
Estimate is based on full-time enrollment. These costs may be reduced by financial aid awards.

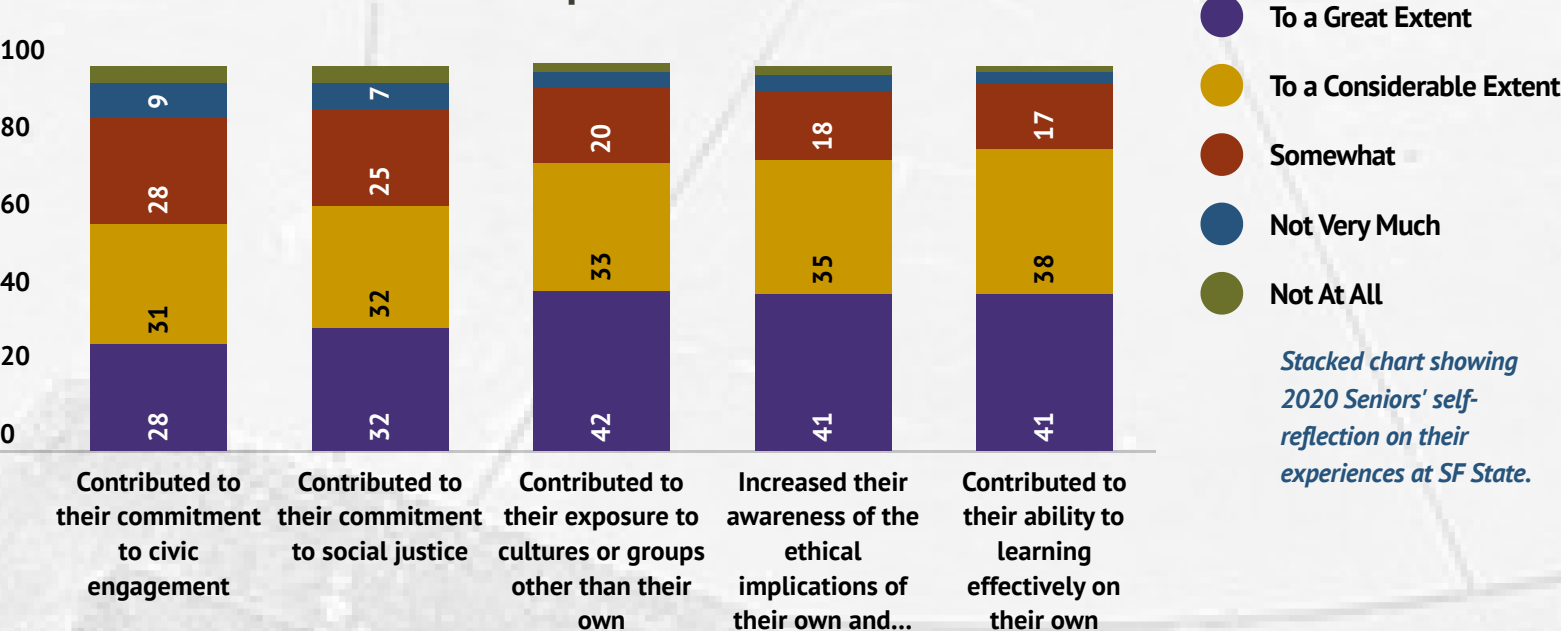
